St. Francis de Sales, Bishop and Doctor of the church, was born of a noble family on 21st August, 1567 at the castle of Sales, near Annecy in Savoy, France. He died at Lyons, France in 1622 on 28th December at the age of 56. Very early in life, Francis showed signs of spiritual

awakening, conscious of God's presence everywhere. He wanted to give himself to God and serve God's people. Commitment was his hall mark, a trait very much in need today. He was courageous and daring facing threats to life in a calm manner, a virtue that makes him so attractive to the young.

Fundamentals of Computer System: In this course students learn about Hardware and Software Basics. They learn about Input/output Devices, Operating Systems basics. They are also taught about how computer works and how technology is improving over the years. They learn history of computers including Windows and many other Operating systems.

Algorithms and Flowcharts: This course is offered by the department as a bridge course in order to teach students a step by step mechanism of developing programs. Algorithm and flowchart are the powerful tools for learning programming. Algorithm helps students to plan a code before its implementation and flowcharts helps to clarify all the steps to solve a problem graphically. It helps students to effectively analyze the problem in order to get a proper solution. It provides better documentation skills that a student may need in future.

Hardware and Networking : Departments offers this course as A Carrier Oriented Course which helps students learn the process of networking. This course also helps to enhance their knowledge about how Hardware and Software works together in different types of networks. This course also teaches the students about various Devices which are used in conjunction with today's networking needs. The knowledge about various electronic devices and equipments which are required in communication and interaction between devices on a computer network is provided in this course. These courses also helps students to make their accounting base strong. The Department offers the following Bridge courses.

1. Communication Skills
2. Basics of Accounting
3. Programming Basics
4. Computer Basics (Word, Excel, Powerpoint)

Communication Skills: In this course students will develop knowledge, skills, and judgment around human communication that facilitate their ability to work collaboratively with others. Such skills could include communication competencies such as managing conflict, understanding small group processes, active listening, appropriate self-disclosure, etc.

Basics of Accounting: In this course students will recognize commonly used financial statements, their components and how information from business transactions flows into these statements. They will be able to demonstrate knowledge of preparation of Financial Statements and or financial schedules in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles through analysis and synthesis of information as well. They will also learn to demonstrate progressive learning of various tax issues and tax forms related to individuals.

Computer Basics (Word, Excel, Powerpoint) : In this course students will learn to create and edit documents. This is the word processing component, and it allows user to type whatever user want and save it to view or edit later. Students will also learn the basics of creating spreadsheets, how to format text and numbers, perform basic calculations and present data in a graphical format. Students do not need any previous experience of Excel but must have a basic understanding of PCs, including familiarity with a keyboard and mouse. They will also learn to create slide presentations that include text, graphics, animation, and transition.
